DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

A small ravine and stream runs from north to south through this farm. The farm lane parallels the stream. The small vertical-plank farmhouse faces west on the eastern slope. Located on the west rim, from north to south, are a stone-based vertical-plank "cave", a log barn, and a frame barn.

The true 1½ story, gabled farmhouse measures two bays long by one bay deep. A porch covers the west facade. Entrances appear in the northern bay of the facade and the southern bay of the rear. 6/6 sash windows light the other bay on either side. Modern windows light the ends. A modern, exterior concrete block stove-flue chimney appears at the center of the rear wall.

The slope of the hill exposes the west and south sides of the cellar. A cellar entrance is located at the south end. Concrete block forms the foundation of the porch and cellar. Battens cover the building's vertical plank walls. Wooden shingles, apparently modern, sheath the gable ends. Asphalt shingles cover the roof.

A spring with a modern cover appears south of the house.

The unusually tall, narrow log barn measures approximately 16' x 20', by 18' tall at the eaves. The v-notched logs are as large as 18" in diameter. The frame barn includes hewn members.


