DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This log house is situated in a hilly wooded area off Dry Run Road approximately one mile from U.S. Rt. 495. The house faces north. It is a story-and-a-half, two bay by one bay gable roof log structure. A two story, one bay by two bay gable roof plank addition, gable end front, is located at the west elevation, connected by a small addition, to the main block. A porch enclosed with assorted old windows covers the facade of both sections of the house. The house is entered from the facade of both the log main block and the plank addition.

Six over six sash windows light the house. The rough saddle notched logs of the main block have been left exposed. Weatherboard siding covers the plank section. Tarpaper covers the roof.

A log barn is located east of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is a common western Maryland type. Houses of this rectangular configuration constructed of log with later plank additions were constructed in Garrett County in the later nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. This house was constructed by Vincent Warnicke and was purchased by Nathaniel Fazenbaker, the father of the present owner in 1908. The present owners, Paul and Violet Fazenbaker Uber, lived in the house until 1968 when they moved into a trailer just east of the house. The Ubers have dairy cows and make and sell cottage cheese, butter and buttermilk from the milk of their cows.


