This two-story frame farmhouse faces north. The three-bay gabled structure includes a two-bay rear ell. A porch covers the facade, which features a central entrance. A second porch, covering the east side of the ell, is enclosed at its south end.

A large brick chimney appears at the intersection of the ell and the main block. 2/2 windows light the house. Asphalt sheets cover the roof, and weatherboards sheath the walls.

A frame bank barn on a stone foundation stands southwest of the house. Two gabled ventilators straddle the roof peak. Horizontal weatherboards sheath the walls.


