This single story, frame, three bay wide gable front house is located at 5626 Hutton Road. Sited on the east side and perpendicular to the highway, the dwelling is rectangle-shaped. Bounded on the north by a board fence and a tree line, the trees extend around to the eastern portion of the property while to the south is an open space shared by the adjacent house. A split rail corner fence serves as a boundary between the facade and a gravel drive which runs parallel with the road and provides access to the southern neighboring houses. Another gravel driveway is just north of the dwelling.

The Holler House, built in the late 1930's, is associated with settlement expansion patterns in fringe areas beyond Oakland's limits. The house and its adjacent neighbors were built occupied by blue collar workers and is typical of low-income Recovery Era architecture.

This single story, frame, three bay wide gable front house is located at 5626 Hutton Road. Sited on the east side and perpendicular to the highway, the dwelling is rectangle-shaped. Bounded on the north by a board fence and a tree line, the trees extend around to the eastern portion of the property while to the south is an open space shared by the adjacent house. A split rail corner fence serves as a boundary between the facade and a gravel drive which runs parallel with the road and provides access to the southern neighboring houses. Another gravel driveway is just north of the dwelling.

Built in the mid- to late-1930s, the aluminum siding clad house rests on a poured concrete foundation, has a two-bay-wide facade, gable-front-roofed porch, and an interior brick chimney. A single story, one room deep, two bay, porch is appended to the rear elevation. The porch has a shed asphalt-shingle covered roof and is partially enclosed. Four wood steps lead to the deck. The porch foundation is not visible; the aluminum siding acts as a skirt.

Most of the six over one double hung sash windows are original with the exception of a small single sash double window unit at the northeast elevation and another single sash unit in the enclosed porch bay; all have wood trim. The single leaf asymmetrical front door is composed of an upper half glass panel and a lower double wood panel.

In addition to the house, there are three outbuildings located on the property. They all exhibit similar features such as single story height and wood frame construction, but only two buildings are over 50 years of age. The garage has a gable roof covered with asphalt shingles, a pair of twelve panel wood doors and weatherboard siding. A vertical wood sided, gable roofed shed is located behind the house and sits upon a concrete block pier foundation.

Newly constructed or realigned roads opened up unusable farmlands to residential development. The current owner noted that the existing configuration of Hutton Road was completed in the 1930's. The house and its adjacent neighbors were occupied by blue collar workers and is typical of low-income Recovery Era architecture








**Resource Sketch Map**
