

The Danny J. Davis House stands one-and-one-half-story tall with a hipped-roof. The dwelling possesses three bays across its main elevation and is three bays deep.

Constructed in 1930 according to Garrett County tax records, the Davis House relates to residential development on the outskirts of Oakland in the early twentieth century.

The Danny J. Davis House (G-IV-A-227) is located just north of Oakland, Maryland, at 830 North Fourth Street (Old U.S. 219). The one-and-one-half-story hipped-roofed frame dwelling is three bays wide by three bays deep. It has a full-width front porch, rear addition, and front and rear dormers. Facing northwest, the house sits on a rectangular lot that slopes down towards the street.

Clad in vinyl siding and resting on a concrete block foundation which encloses a full cellar, the house has a modern hip-roofed full-width rear addition. Sheathed in asphalt shingles, the dwelling's roofs are finished with box cornices covered with vinyl. The centrally-placed gable-roofed front and rear dormers share a ridgeline with the main roof. Fenestration consists of single and banded one-over-one wooden double hung sash decorated with fixed vinyl shutters. Narrow plain wood boards surround the doors and windows. A modern exterior concrete block chimney pile is located on the southwest elevation.

There are three entrances into the dwelling. The offset front door is flanked by windows. The full-width front porch has a hip roof supported by narrow square wood posts, poured concrete deck and closed wood rails. The posts and rail appear to have been recently rebuilt. The back door located on the northeast elevation of the rear addition opens onto a shed-roofed side porch with pressure-treated wood posts and balustrade. French doors open into a half-width modern screen porch off the southeast (rear) elevation.

A modern frame two-car garage is situated off the eastern corner of the house. Clad in vinyl siding, it has front-facing gable-roof sheathed with asphalt shingles. A macadam driveway northeast of the house leads to the garage. A brick walk connects the driveway with the side porch.

Constructed in 1930 according to Garrett County tax records, the Danny J. Davis House relates to residential development on the outskirts of Oakland in the early twentieth century. Characterized by an extended period of growth, Oakland's early twentieth century expansion occurred primarily along previous road networks. Garrett Highway, a major north-south roadway built in Garrett County in 1916, used North Fourth Street as its access into Oakland.

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

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North 4th Street
