The Joseph and Carolyn Germain House is recommended not eligible for the National Register. The dwelling does not relate to a significant broad pattern contributing to the Oakland area's development during the early twentieth century. Research has not identified any significant associations with historic persons or events. The house neither reflects the distinctive characteristics of a particular architectural style nor embodies the representative work of a master craftsman or method of construction. The building also does not appear to potentially provide important information for the study of history.

The Joseph and Carolyn Germain House (G-IV-A-228) is located just north of Oakland, Maryland, at 841 North Fourth Street (Old U.S. 219). The two-story frame four-square dwelling has a pyramidal roof. Two bays wide and two rooms deep, it has a full-width wrapping front porch that is enclosed its side (northeast) elevation. Facing southeast, the house sits on a rectangular lot that slopes away from the street. The southwest lot line is defined by a row of large evergreen trees.

The dwelling is clad in wooden shingles painted blue and rests on a poured concrete which encloses a full cellar. Sheathed in asphalt shingles, the dwelling's roofs are finished with box cornices covered with vinyl. Supported by modern turned wooden porch posts with an open balustrade, the hip-roofed front porch has a poured concrete deck. A modern pressure-treated wood deck leads to the sliding-glass rear entrance on the northwest elevation. The deck is built over a concrete block cellar entrance off the west corner of the house.

Fenestration consists primarily of one-over-one wooden double hung sash. There is a cottage window with a multi-paned top sash on the front (southeast) elevation. In addition, wooden hopper windows are found in the enclosed porch. The windows are decorated with fixed vinyl shutters. Narrow wooden molding surrounds the door and window openings. A modern exterior concrete block chimney pile is located on the southwest (side) elevation.

A flat-roofed concrete block garage with attached open-sided sheds is situated west of the house along the southwest edge of the lot. A macadam driveway follows the lot line to the garage. A concrete walk connects leads to the front entrance from the street.

Built in 1915 according to Garrett County tax records, the Joseph and Carolyn Germain House relates to the residential settlement of areas surrounding Oakland during the early twentieth century. Construction of the Garrett Highway occurred six years earlier primarily following earlier unimproved roads and used North Fourth Street as its access into Oakland. Characterized by an extended period of growth, Oakland's early twentieth century expansion occurred primarily along previous road networks.

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
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

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


NORTH 4th ST.
