

The Lewis House is a two-story, frame, side gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay-wide facade, poured concrete foundation and two exterior chimney flues and one interior brick chimney stack.

The Lewis House, built in 1920 according to local tax records, relates to the expanded settlement of areas previously located on the fringes of the town of Oakland. Characterized by development along existing corridors, some of these areas were subsequently annexed into the town of Oakland's corporate boundaries. By 1916 this area of Garrett County was traversed by the hard-surfaced US 219, or Garrett Highway. This house is a fair representation of early twentieth century domestic architecture.

The Lewis House is located along US219 at 13917 Garrett Highway. Sitting parallel to the road, the house is bordered on the west by a post and metal fence, on the north and south by dense vegetation and on the east by a driveway and an enclosed dog pen. Built into an upward sloping hill, the dwelling is adjacent to several tall pine trees.

This is a single story frame front gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay-wide facade, a poured concrete foundation and two exterior chimney flues and one interior brick chimney stack. Both the northeast and southwest elevations have single story, frame shed roofed additions. These wings rest upon concrete block foundations and like the main block have asphalt roof shingles and exterior fiberboard siding. Projecting from the north wall is partially enclosed single story, frame, gable-roofed entryway. Appended to the south addition is a lattice-covered, single story, shed roofed storage area.

The majority of windows throughout the dwelling are 1/1 light, double-hung sashes with a few metal sash sliding and hopper units. Two of the three single leaf doors have upper glass panes with lower wood panels while the rear door was obscured by a storm door. Although there are numerous modern outbuildings on the property, there is one structure which is over fifty years of age. It's a single story, frame, shed-roofed building with asphalt shingle siding, a plastic covered single pane hopper window and has exposed roof rafters.



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
Resource Sketch Map
