DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Claude King House is located on the N side of MD Rt. 38, about a mile E of Sand Flat Road. The house is backed by fields.

The house is a 2-story, gable-roofed ell-plan frame dwelling with a three bay, center-door facade. The facade points S and the facade door is covered by a one-story gable-roofed porch. The ell on the E elevation is partially filled by a one-story, shed-roofed addition.

The house rests on a concrete-covered stone foundation and is covered by German siding. The windows are 2 over 2 and one over one sash and have drip moldings and plain board surrounds. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The house has one interior brick stove chimney at the center of the main block. The facade porch has an asphalt shingle roof which is supported by turned posts.

N of the house, on a clothesline pole is a metal sign reading "Deer Park Hotel". According to a neighbor, it is from the old Deer Park Hotel railroad depot.
