DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ferdinand N. Reis House is located on the E side of King Reis Lane, about a quarter mile N of MD Rt. 38. The house is set back from the road and is surrounded by trees.

The house is a 2-story gable-roofed T-plan frame building a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points W and is covered by a one-story, enclosed, hipped-roofed porch. The T is filled on the S elevation by two two-story, shed-roofed additions.

The house rests on a stone foundation and is covered by asbestos shingles. The windows are 2 over 2 and 1 over 1 sash and have plain board surrounds. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One of the additions on the S elevation is covered with aluminum siding.

The house has one interior brick stove chimney on the N side of the ell. The facade porch has an asphalt shingle roof and 1 over 1 sash windows. The interior arrangement has a center staircase with a single room on either side.

S of the house are two cast iron post lamps with white globe tops.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries. Ferdinand Reis opened the first telegraph tower at the Deer Park Hotel about 1910, according to the occupant, his daughter. The post lamps were bought from the Kelly Springfield Tire Co., Cumberland, between 1922 and 1925.
