DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Jack Cooper House is located on the south side of Spring Glade Road, about a half mile west of Sand Flat Road. The house is surrounded by trees. The house is a 2-story, gable-roofed Ell-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points north and is covered by a one-story, hipped-roofed porch. The Ell, on the south and east elevations, is partially filled with a one-story, shed-roofed, enclosed porch.

The house rests on a poured concrete foundation and is covered by aluminum siding. The windows are 2/2 sash and all surrounds have been obscured. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and has three small cross gables on the facade.

The house has one interior brick stove chimney at the center of the Ell. The facade porch roof is covered with asphalt siding and supported by wrought iron posts.

The interior arrangement of the house displays a central stair.


