The house on the Ervin R. Nazelrod Farm is a two story, frame, T-plan building with a partial facade porch and a one story hip-roofed addition on the southeast side of the rear wing. The facade has a symmetrical, three bay, center door arrangement. The building rests on a whitewashed, coursed, roughly squared stone foundation. All windows are two over two sash with narrow, plain board surrounds and sills, except for the southwest endwall which has a pair of three over one sash. Its gable roof is covered with corrugated metal and has enclosed rafters ends with a plain board frieze. South of the house is a shed-roofed, concrete block springhouse. To the north, is a frame, gable-roofed, bank barn on a stepped foundation of coursed, roughly squared stone.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ervin R. Nazelrod Farm is located on the west side of Chestnut Grove Road approximately .5 mile south of Maryland Route 135. The facade of the house faces the road, pointing northeast.

The house is a two story, frame, T-plan building with a partial facade porch and a one story hip-roofed addition on the southeast side of the rear wing. The facade has a symmetrical, three bay, center door arrangement.

The building rests on a whitewashed, coursed, roughly squared stone foundation with a batten door basement entrance on its southeast endwall. The exterior walls are covered with brick patterned asphalt siding. All windows are two over two sash with narrow, plain board surrounds and sills, except for the southwest endwall which has a pair of three over one sash. Its gable roof is covered with corrugated metal and has enclosed rafters ends with a plain board frieze. The facade porch rests on a poured concrete foundation with lattice ornamentation; four battered columns support its shallow gable roof.

South of the house is a shed-roofed, concrete block springhouse. To the north, on the east side of Chestnut Grove Road is a frame, gable-roofed, bank barn on a stepped foundation of coursed, roughly squared stone.


