The Danny E. Jackson House is a frame, two-story, three bay by one bay, gable-roofed building on a dry laid stone foundation. Its facade has a symmetrical center door arrangement. The door has been blocked, however, and the facade orientation changed to the southeast side of the one-story, gable-roofed rear addition. The original windows are 6/6 sash, several of which have 1/1 sash replacements. The southeast gable is pierced by a six pane casement window. Its original siding is obscured by brick-patterned asphalt.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Danny E. Jackson House is located on the north side of Gnegy Church-Red Oak Road approximately 1.2 miles west of U.S. Route 219. It is situated at the end of a dirt lane .2 mile from the road, just east of Sand Spring Run. The original facade points northeast.

The house is a frame, two story, gable-roofed building. Its basic configuration is a three bay by one bay main block with a one story, one room, gable-roofed rear addition. A one story, shed addition fills in the northwest side of the building.

The facade on the main block has a symmetrical three bay, center door arrangement with the central bay of the second floor unfenestrated. The door has been blocked and the entrance facade has been changed to the southeast side of the rear gable addition. The windows on the main block are six over six sash on the second floor and appear to have their original glass. The first floor is lit by one over one sash replacements. This portion of the house rests on a foundation of dry laid, irregular, flat stones.

The gable addition has a shed porch extending the length of its southeast side, where the only entrance to the building is located. Its southwest end is lit by a picture window and a two-pane casement in the gable. The foundation under this area is of heavily mortared rubble stone. The shed addition sits on a cement block foundation.

All sections of the house are covered with brick patterned asphalt siding and the roof is covered with corrugated metal. An exterior cinderblock chimney has been installed on the northwest endwall of the main block.

A barn was situated northeast of the house, but only traces of its foundation remain.


