The John Rolf Farm is an early twentieth century site consisting of a circa 1909 frame dwelling, several small frame sheds and a privy of unknown date, a 1940's frame bank barn, and a late 1970's machine shed and corn crib.

The house is a rectangular, two-story gable-roofed building on a stone foundation. Its three bay, center door facade is sheltered by a shed-roofed porch that continues around to the southwest elevation. Weatherboard siding sheathes the walls, and all windows are 1/1 sash with plain board surrounds. Two interior brick chimnies are located on the southeast side of the ridgeline.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The John Rolf Farm is located on the east side of Maryland Route 219 approximately one mile south of its intersection with U.S. Route 50. The farm is situated on a hill that slopes down (southeast) from the road.

The house is a rectangular, two story, gable-roofed building of frame construction. Its facade is symmetrically arranged with three bays and a center door. The other three elevations, each having three bays, are irregularly spaced.

The house rests on a stepped foundation of coursed, roughly squared stone. Because of the grade of the hill an additional lower floor is created to the rear. This lower floor has a center door with a small, square, single pane window on each side.

The exterior walls are covered by weatherboard with cornerboards and all windows are one over one sash with plain board surrounds, sills, and simple drip moldings. The roof is covered with corrugated metal and has two interior brick chimneys on the southeast side of the ridge line.

A shed-roofed porch extends the full length of the facade and continues around to the southwest gable end where it terminates in a small enclosed room. The porch is supported by eight square wooden posts and rests on a recently replaced foundation of cinderblock.

Directly northwest of the house is a depression in the ground where a log dwelling formerly stood.

Also on the property is a shed chicken house, several small vertical board sheds, a privy, a frame bank barn (ca. 1940's), and a corn crib and machine shed both built in the late 1970's.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

It is thought that John Rolf built this house circa 1909. It was not the first dwelling to be constructed on the property, however. John's father, William Rolf, came to this country from Germany, and aquired this piece of land in 1859. On it, he built a log dwelling and a log barn, neither of which stands today.


