DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Jesse H. Harsh House is located on the E side of Silver Knob Road, just NW of Frozen Camp Run. The site includes a house and a frame bank barn.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling measuring two bays on the facade by two bays on the sides. A one-story, shed-roofed addition runs the length of the NE elevation and a one-story, shed-roofed porch runs the length of the facade. The facade points SW.

The house rests on a poured concrete foundation and is covered with white weatherboarding. The windows on the main block are two over two sash, except for the first floor windows on the SE gable end, which are three over one. All windows have simple cornices and plain board surrounds. The door is placed in the SE bay of the facade.

The roof is covered with diamond-patterned asphalt shingles and has exposed rafter ends. The house has one central stove chimney of yellow brick. The addition on the NE elevation has a concrete block foundation and is also covered with white weatherboarding. The windows are one over one sash, and one has been replaced with a square, single pane. The roof is corrugated metal. From the SE side of the addition extends a small porch on a modern sandstone foundation. The roof is a lattice covered with corrugated fibreglas, and is supported by wrought iron posts.

The facade porch has a new foundation of sandstone. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and is supported by four tapered posts.

The interior is unknown.

The barn rests on a low stone foundation and is covered with vertical boards. The bank entrance is on the E elevation. The barn lies some distance N of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen section, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

This house is the second dwelling on the property. An older house once stood immediately in front of the current house site. The Hesses bought the land ca. 1916 and soon after demolished the older structure. They then built the current house. The barn is probably contemporary with the older dwelling.




Table Rock, MD-WV
