The George P. Atkins House is a frame, two story, gable-roofed building on a coursed, roughly squared stone foundation. Its basic configuration is a three bay by one bay main block with a one bay by one bay rear ell. An enclosed porch extends the length of the facade and continues to the northwest endwall, the rear of the house, and the northwest side of the ell. A bay window occupies the first floor level of the northwest endwall. The facade has a three bay, center door arrangement with the second floor, center bay unfenestrated. Two over two sash windows light the building except for the bay window which has one over one sash.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The George P. Atkins House is located on the northeast side of Fairview Road approximately .7 mile west of Wilson-Corunna Road. The facade points southwest, toward the road.

The house is a frame, two story, gable-roofed building on a coursed, roughly squared stone foundation. Its basic configuration is a three bay by one bay main block with a one bay by one bay rear ell. An enclosed porch extends the length of the facade and continues to the northwest endwall, the rear of the house, and the northwest side of the ell. A bay window occupies the first floor level of the northwest endwall. The facade has a three bay, center door arrangement with the second floor, center bay unfenestrated.

Two over two sash windows light the building except for the bay window which has one over one sash. A basement entrance is located on the northeast endwall of the ell. The exterior walls of the building are covered with white asbestos shingles. Asphalt shingles cover the roof. An interior brick stove chimney is situated on the ridgline between the main block and the rear ell.

The first floor interior of the main block is divided into two rooms by a closed, straight run staircase. Both of these rooms are paneled with varnished, narrow bead-edged board on the walls and ceiling. The wall boards are laid vertically. Door and window moldings consist of an oversized, flattened ovolo flanked by quirk ogees, and bull's eye cornerblocks. A kitchen occupies the first floor of the rear ell.
