Early 20th century

The Roy W. Harvey Shop is a two story, hip-roofed building of balloon frame construction on a poured concrete foundation. It is rectangular in plan with an interior brick chimney located in the center. A wide batten door opens on the south elevation and a horizontally sliding door is located on the east endwall. Loading entrances pierce the second floor of the east and west endwalls. Irregularly spaced two over sash windows light the building on all elevations.

The interior is divided into two rooms by a plank partition wall. The western room is lined with horizontal plank and has an open stairway positioned at the northern end of the partition. The eastern room contains the chimney which corbels out into the room and has a metal, bell-shaped devise embedded in it to channel air up the chimney. No stove or heat source is attached to the chimney, but this does appear to be a central work area.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Roy W. Harvey Shop is located on the southeast side of Wilson-Corunna Road approximately 1.3 miles north of Old Wilson Road. It is situated at the end of a dirt lane .3 mile from the road. This shop is part of a complex of buildings which includes a dwelling, a summer house, a shed, and a garage.

The shop is a two story, hip-roofed building of balloon frame construction on a poured concrete foundation. It is rectangular in plan with an interior brick chimney located in the center. A wide batten door opens on the south elevation and a horizontally sliding door is located on the east endwall. Loading entrances pierce the second floor of the east and west endwalls. Irregularly spaced two over two sash windows light the building on all elevations.

The roof is covered with asphalt roll siding and has exposed rafter ends. The framing system of 1½ inch by 4 inch studs is exposed on the interior. Horizontal board forms the exterior wall surface with an additional covering of weatherboard.

The interior is divided into two rooms by a plank partition wall. The western room is lined with horizontal plank and has an open stairway positioned at the northern end of the partition. The eastern room contains the chimney which corbels out into the room and has a metal, bell-shaped devise embedded in it to channel air up the chimney. No stove or heat source is attached to the chimney, but this does appear to be a central work area. (see negative frame 30 A)

The dwelling, which is south of the shop, is a frame, two story, gable-roofed building. It has been so altered, however, that it lacks architectural integrity.

The summer house, situated just west of the shop, is a recent construction. It is a one room log structure with a gable roof that projects over its west facade. The logs are saddle notched and chinked with mortar. An exterior stone chimney is located on the east endwall.

Further west is a gable-roofed garage with a ground level of large hollow brick and a frame upper story.

South of the shop is a frame, gable-roofed outbuilding on a roughly squared stone foundation. Its exterior is covered with board and batten siding while the interior is lined with German siding.




