DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated among pine trees in a hilly area on Gortner Road approximately 3/8 miles southeast of Rt. 219 and the town of Gortner. The house faces northeast. It is a story-and-a-half, four bay by one bay gable roof structure with a gable dormer on the facade roof fashioned in a Gothic cottage style. A two story, four bay by one bay gable roof addition is located on the rear, southwest elevation, the gable of which extends over the roof of the main block. A single story three bay long addition is located at the southeast elevation of both the addition and the main block. A wooden porch supported by turned posts with jig-sawn balustrades cover the facade. Entrances are located on the center facade and at the rear elevation.

A central brick chimney and an interior gable end brick chimney are both located on the main block. Two over two sash windows with plain surrounds light the house. The cellar is entered at the southeast elevation. Aluminum siding framed with cornerboards cover the exterior with asphalt shingles on the roof.

A frame barn is located on the property.




Table Rock, MD:WV
