Pleasant Valley Church and Cemetery

ca. 1900

Pleasant Valley Church is a frame, one story, gable-roofed building on a coursed, roughly squared stone foundation. Its basic configuration is a one bay by four bay plan with a three-sided apse at the north endwall and a vestibule addition on the south endwall. Elongated five over six sash windows with pointed window heads light the west and east elevations. These windows are glazed with green and blue panes and have plain board surrounds with simple drip moldings and narrow sills. The exterior walls of the building are sheathed with weatherboard siding and the roof, which has exposed rafter ends, has a covering of asphalt shingles.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Pleasant Valley Church is located on the east side of Pleasant Valley Road .1 mile south of its intersection with Jasper Riley Road. It is situated parallel to the road with its facade pointing south and the cemetery lying to the north.

The church is a frame, one story, gable-roofed building on a coursed, roughly squared stone foundation. Its basic configuration is a one bay by four bay plan with a three-sided apse at the north endwall and a gabled vestibule addition on the south endwall.

Elongated five over six sash windows with pointed window heads light the west and east elevations. These windows are glazed with green and blue panes and have plain board surrounds with simple drip moldings and narrow sills. The exterior walls of the building are sheathed with weatherboard siding and the roof, which has exposed rafter ends, has a covering of asphalt shingles.

The vestibule addition sits on a concrete block foundation and has weatherboard siding. A double door entrance pierces its gable end and a one over one sash window lights the east and west elevations. The asphalt-shingled roof has a fascia board cornice.

The cemetery to the north contains monuments dating from the 1910's to the 1970's. The major families interred there are: Bernard, Bittinger, Bowers, Gilpin, Liller, Lower, Moomaw, Queer, Roy, Schlosnagle, Shaffer, Swires, Twigg, and White.


