DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Pleasant Valley Grange Hall lies in the northern end of Pleasant Valley, a few miles south of Oakland. It is typical of grange hall construction for Garrett County.

It is a one-story, six bay by one bay frame structure with a gable roof. It has a gable end facade with an offset entrance and faces SW, toward Jasper Riley Road.

The foundation consists of square wooden posts enclosed by boards. The walls are covered with german siding, painted or stained grey, and the gable roof is covered with tarpaper.

A shed roof porch, covering the facade entrance, is situated at the southern half of the facade.

There is an offset entrance on the rear, NE elevation toward the east end of the elevation.

Windows are 2/2 sash with plain board surrounds. Several have been boarded up. There is an interior brick chimney.

It appears that the grange hall is presently being used as a residence.

The structure resembles early 20th century rural schools in form, although it extends to about twice the length of most school buildings.




Table Rock MD:WV
