DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ray Gnegy Farmhouse lies at the northern end of Pleasant Valley just south of Oakland. It is a 2-story 3 bay by 1 bay frame house based on the ell-plan. The facade faces southwest and is covered with a 1-story shed porch. A 1-story, shed-roofed, enclosed porch fills the east corner of the ell.

It rests on a stone foundation. Walls are covered with German siding which is covered with asphalt siding. The gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

Windows are 3/1 sash. Palladian style windows are located at the attic story of both gable ends of the main block. There is a central brick chimney.

A frame bank barn, silo and four outbuildings are associated with this site.
