The house on the Harvey C. Yoder Farm is a two story, frame building on a whitewashed rubble stone foundation. Its basic configuration is a T-plan. The facade occupies the southeast side of the leg of the "T" and the southeast endwall. This endwall takes the form of a gable-roofed bay window. A porch extends around the southeast and northeast elevations of the leg of the T. Two over two sash windows with plain board surrounds and drip moldings light the building. The facade door is composed of a frosted glass window in a floral design set over six square sunburst panels. A transom light tops the doorframe. The exterior walls of the house are covered with weatherboard siding. A frame, gable-roofed bank barn on a poured concrete foundation is situated southwest of the house.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Harvey C. Yoder Farm is located on the south side of Paul Friend Road approximately .7 mile east of U.S. Route 219. The farm is situated at the end of a dirt lane .1 mile from the road.

The house is a two story, frame building on a whitewashed rubble stone foundation. Its basic configuration is a T-plan. The facade occupies the southeast side of the leg of the "T" and the southeast endwall. This endwall takes the form of a gable-roofed bay window. A porch extends around the southeast and northeast elevations of the leg of the T. A one story, shed-roofed addition on a concrete block foundation covers the southwest elevation.

Two over two sash windows with plain board surrounds and drip moldings light the building. The bay window is lit by a pair of two over two sash on its main face and by single one over one sash on its two side faces. The facade door is composed of a frosted glass window in a floral design set over six square sunburst panels. A transom light tops the doorframe.

The exterior walls of the house are covered with weatherboard siding. The gable roof has a covering of corrugated metal and its rafter ends are exposed and decoratively trimmed. The porch has five turned posts supporting its shed roof.

A frame, gable-roofed bank barn on a poured concrete foundation is situated southwest of the house. Louvered ventilation panels pierce the walls on all elevations. The barn is sheathed in weatherboard and has an earthen bank entrance on its west side. A cylindrical metal ventilator with a pointed cap is located on the middle of the ridgeline.

Several small, frame outbuildings are also included on the property.


