It was built by the grandfather of present owner Noah Schrock, and is typical of houses built by Pennsylvania German settlers, especially in the Grantsville area.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Noah D. Schrock Farm lies in Pleasant Valley, approximately 1½ miles south of amish community of Gortner. It is typical of the Garrett County farms.

The farmhouse is a two-story, four bay by two bay dwelling with a two-story, two bay by one-bay gable roofed addition on the S elevation, and one-story enclosed shed porches across the facade, west elevation and the rear, east elevation.

The main block of the house rests on a stone foundation; the addition is supported by a cement block foundation. Walls are covered with weatherboard siding which in turn is covered with asbestos shingles. The gable roofs on the main block and addition are covered with asphalt shingles. The shed roofs on the porches are covered with corrugated metal.

The facade of the house faces west and has an offset entrance to the south. The rear entrance is also offset to the south.

The windows are predominately 6/6 sash. There is an exterior end brick chimney on the south elevation of the main block and an interior cinder block chimney in the main block of the house.

This site includes a frame bank barn.




Table Rock: MD:WV
