DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The W. P. Lee Farm consists of a late nineteenth century frame dwelling, a frame bank barn, a granary, and a privy. The house is a two story, gable-roofed building on a foundation of coursed roughly squared stone. Its basic configuration is a three bay by one bay center hall plan with a two story rear wing and both facade and rear porches.

The facade (E elevation) has a symmetrical, three bay, center door arrangement with a central cross gable and a full length porch. The windows on this elevation and all other elevations are 2/2 sash with plain board surrounds and simple drip boards. Four chamfered posts support the hip-roofed porch. Both endwalls are lit by one window per floor.

The wing is attached to the center of the rear elevation forming an overall T-plan. Its south side serves as a rear entrance since a door a porch are located there. The hip-roofed porch is supported by four chamfered posts with a square baluster railing. Its north and west sides are covered with new siding and may have had their window openings altered in the process.

The building's frame is sheathed with diagonal board which is then covered with German siding and cornerboards. Its facade gable is decorated with flat boards that radiate out from the lintel of the second floor, center window, and a round medallion with a six pointed star. This gable also has the remains of a spindle bargeboard.

The roof is covered with alternating rows of square and fishscale shingles. Its rafter ends are exposed and underlined by a plain board frieze. A brick chimney is situated on the ridgeline of the rear wing where it joins the main block.




Table Rock, MD-WV
