The Donald A. Tucker is a part frame, part log house. The front frame section is two stories high, two bays long and one bay deep with a gable roof. The rear V-notched log section is a single story three bay by one bay structure with a gable roof that kicks out.

The frame section is covered with asphalt siding except on the northwest elevation where the weatherboard siding is left uncovered. The log section is covered with the same asphalt siding with the exception of the northwest elevation and the southwest under the porch.

A springhouse is located northeast of the house.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This part frame, part log house is situated in a wooded area on White Church-Steyer Road approximately one mile north of Steyer Gorman Road. The house faces northeast. The front, frame section is two stories high, two bays long and one bay deep with a gable roof. The rear V-notched log section is a single story three bay by one bay structure with a gable roof that kicks out. The log section has a inset porch with an entrance on the southeast elevation. A plain wooden porch covers the entrance on the facade of the frame section. The house is also entered from the northwest elevation of the main block as well as the facade entrance set to the east end.

The log section has a exterior stone gable end chimney on the southwest elevation. The house is lit predominately by two over two sash windows. Plain surrounds with drip cap molding frames the windows on the frame section. The frame section is covered with asphalt siding except on the northwest elevation where the weatherboard siding is left uncovered. The log section is covered with the same asphalt siding with the exception of the northwest elevation and the southwest under the porch. Tar paper covers the roof.

A springhouse is located northeast of the house.
