DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Tony Terrant Farm is located on the west side of Red Oak-Gnegy Church Road approximately .2 mile west of Kempton Road. The facade of the house faces the road, pointing northeast.

The house is a two story, gable-roofed, frame building. Its basic configuration is an ell-plan with a symmetrical, three bay, center door facade. A full facade shed porch continues to the sides of the building and extends the length of both endwalls. At the rear a one story shed addition fills in the northwest side of the ell and a one story gable addition abuts the southwest endwall.

Although the basic form of the building remains, several alterations detract from its architectural integrity. All of the windows are one over one sash replacements and the first floor has had picture windows installed. The entire building has been sheathed in aluminum siding, including the box cornice and porch railing. Also, three cement block chimnies have been added to the rear wing.

The frame bank barn, which is situated west of the house, remains essentially intact. Its exterior walls are covered with weatherboard and they are pierced by louvered ventilation panels on all but the southwest elevation. The building sits on a coursed, roughly squared stone foundation and has a wooden bank entrance on its northwest side. The gable roof is covered with standing seam tin.

The stone foundation of a small outbuilding is located between the house and barn. A board and batten door with a picket gate open into this basement level on the southeast side. Hewn sills rest on top of the foundation but the upper portion of the building no longer stands.


