DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If Known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

123-25-27 Second Street is part of the commercial block of Oakland's main business street of approximately five adjoining buildings. Presently containing a commercial establishment (clothing store), the ground floor front has been remodeled. The storey and a half above this has been unaltered (as is so often the case) and is a metal, late Victorian commercial facade (see A.D. Naylor Building, G-16). The fenestration is two groups of two and ~~th~~ree windows each, and there are modified unfluted Ionic columns separating the individual windows; recessed panels separate the window groupings. Above the windows is a narrow frieze of fleur-de-lis, above which is a larger frieze containing four wreaths connected by an unbroken chain of garlands. This is topped by an egg and dart molding, above which is a simply bracketed cornice.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

This commercial building is an amalgamation of three separate buildings (plus log structure added at rear) that were, at one time, unified visually (as well as structurally) with the stamped metal front. Although it is easier to stamp out such details as found here than to carve them or make them in plaster, details such as egg and dart offer sophistication normally not to be found in such towns.

Mr. Jones, the present owner, bought the building from the Condor family in April 1970; the Ravenscrofts added the log section in 1946 [see attached supplement, G-22A].
