

The Emerick House is situated at 347 West Liberty Street just outside the Oakland city limits. Located on the east side of the road, the property is bounded on the west by the road's edge of pavement, on the north by a wire and wood post fence, and on the east and south elevations by wide open space. The house sits approximately twenty feet from Liberty Street, perpendicular to the road and is built upon a flat lot which gently slopes upward to the rear of the property. A double width automobile parking area is found immediately in front of the two-story house.

The Emerick House, erected in 1914 according to county tax records, is associated with expansion settlement pattern in fringe areas previously located outside the Oakland town limits. The house is a lackluster example of early twentieth century residential architecture.

The Emerick House is situated at 347 West Liberty Street just outside the Oakland city limits. Located on the east side of the road, the property is bounded on the west by the road's edge of pavement, on the north by a wire and wood post fence, and on the east and south elevations by wide open space. The house sits approximately twenty feet from Liberty Street, perpendicular to the road and is built upon a flat lot which gently slopes upward to the rear of the property. A double width automobile parking area is found immediately in front of the two-story house.

The wood frame, three-bay-wide, facade gable, asphalt-shingled roof dwelling has features such a aluminum siding, an exterior concrete block chimney with clay flues and modern replacement, double-hung sash, fixed pane, and sliding sash window units. The house has two, single story, open porches: the facade porch is three-bays wide, has square wood posts, and an astroturf covered concrete floor while the rear cantilevered porch has an asphalt shingle shed roof.

Immediately behind the house, to the east, is a single story, wood frame, facade-gable roofed barn. Built in two sections, the barn is accessed by double leaf wooden doors and has a concrete block foundation wall.

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
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

