The Ferguson House is located at 565 West Liberty Street on the road's north side. The rectangle-shaped dwelling is situated approximately twenty feet from the street on a relatively flat, treeless, parcel of land just south of the Youghioghney River. Sitting parallel to the road, the house is accessed by a gravel drive which extends west towards the frame carport. The property is bordered on the north and west by the paved edge of roadways, on the east by a large garden, and on the south by a green open space.

The Ferguson House, built sometime in the 1930s according to a site visit, is associated with expansion settlement patterns in fringe areas previously located outside the Oakland town limits. Characterized by development along existing transportation corridors, these areas were eventually incorporated into the town of Oakland's boundaries. This heavily altered dwelling does not exemplify mid - twentieth century residential architecture.

The Ferguson is located at 565 West Liberty Street on the road's north side. The rectangle-shaped dwelling is situated approximately twenty feet from the street on a relatively flat, treeless, parcel of land just south of the Youghiogheny River. Sitting parallel to the road, the house is accessed by a gravel drive which extends west towards the frame carport. The property is bordered on the north and west by the paved edge of roadways, on the east by a large garden, and on the south by a green open space.

This is a single story, frame gambrel-roofed dwelling with an interior brick chimney stack foundation. Appended to the elevation is a one-story, single pile, frame, gable roofed addition, which rests upon a concrete block foundation. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and located on the northeast wall is an engaged two bay-wide raised entry porch. A full width, single-story enclosed porch is attached the south elevation. Sitting upon a concrete block foundation, the porch entry is accessed by an exposed wooden deck with wooden steps and is surrounded by a vertical wood railing which is attached to the hand rails and balustrade. The entire dwelling is sheathed with aluminum siding.

The exterior fenestration has variably sized windows but most are 1/1 light, double-hung sashes with aluminum surrounds. The main block's foundation units are fixed six light windows. The front door is a single leaf, modern unit with an upper window panel on top of a wooden panel. The rear door has multiple lights and a lower wood panel section. A modern wood frame carport has gable roof which is covered with asphalt shingles. Its gable ends and roof eaves are sheathed with aluminum.



