DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

100 S. Washington St. is a one and a half story three bay by three bay frame dwelling on a lighted, partially raised granite basement. Built in the last decade of the 19th century, this picturesque cottage has the shape of a Greek cross. A one story frame kitchen wing extends from the rear. The house stands on the corner of S. Washington St. and Congress Avenue surrounded by a spacious and well cared for yard and garden on three sides. The house is covered with aluminum siding.

The principle facade, three bays across, has an advanced center bay with an above grade porch across it. Repeating the treatment of the main gables, the triangular pediment of the front gable of the porch is outlined with plain brackets. The porch is supported by piers with molded bases and capitals. In place of side railings, the porch has benches, their backs made of vertical slats formed to resemble arrows. Another porch with benches and lattice work top and sides is on the north elevation of the kitchen wing, and on the kitchen wing at the south elevation is a small one bay porch with a hipped roof and lattice across the front. Across the south elevation is a porch with a deck on top of it. The porch is enclosed with glass to create a sun room.

Windows are spaced evenly on the facade, one in each story of the advanced center bay and one on the first story of the recessed bays that flank it. Throughout the dwelling, the windows have 4/4 light double hung sash and are flanked by louvered aluminum shutters.

A pair of windows are in the advanced center bay on the north and south elevations.

The entrance is in the center of the facade. It contains a six panel door flanked by three light sidelights and a large rectangular five light transom. Other entrances are found on the flanks, rear and wing.

The main section has a cross gable roof which is covered with asphalt shingles, a bracketed box cornice with returns at the four gable ends. The wing has a gable roof with the ridge running east to west. Originally the main section had a pair of brick central chimneys, but the north chimney has been removed.

Interior: The house has a center hall plan with a small foyer and cross hall in front and one room on either side. "Marbelized" Slate mantel pieces are on the south wall of the living room and north room of the dining room.

Outbuildings: A rectangular clapboard out building with a slate roof having finials on either end, is found at the rear.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In the tradition of Andrew Jackson Downing 100 S. Washington St., is a perfect little vine covered cottage. Built in the 1890's, the house is one and a half stories high and has a Greek cross plan covered by four prominent bracketed gables. Small porches with built in benches and the use of lattice work add to the picturesque quality of the structure. Since the dwelling's long side faces on the 500 block of Congress Avenue it joins with HA-542, HA-109, HA-1125 to form one of the most architecturally pleasing street scapes in Havre de Grace.

All along South Washington Street are well maintained, mid to late 19th century, frame dwellings, relating to each other in size, scale, style and material. Many of them are gabled, Carpenter Gothic cottages on grassy lots that extend to the alleys behind them; built as one and two family dwellings most of them retain that scheme of occupancy. However, because Harford Memorial Hospital is one block west, the neighborhood has become vulnerable to the intrusion of buildings related to the medical profession. Displacing the old houses, these new buildings not only represent architectural intrusions but discourage buyers who are attracted initially to the cozy, homogeneous appearance of this part of Havre de Grace but fear it is changing.


