The Whyte House is another late 19th century frame house built in a vernacular Queen Anne style. Located on a corner, the house is two and a half stories high and four bays wide including the pentagonal wing on the west side. An eight bay veranda extends across the front and around the side of the house.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

617 Fountain Street is a two and a half story four bay frame dwelling on a granite ashlar foundation. Built in c. 1890, in a vernacular Queen Anne style, the house faces south on Fountain Street, at the corner of Centennial Alley; a frame dwelling is west of it. The structure has a two story octagonal wing on the west side which joins the main section and forms a fourth bay on the front elevation, the last three bays being advanced. A one and a half story addition joins the rear of the main section. Pale green asbestos shingles cover the whole structure including the attic gables. The owner lives on the first floor and rents out apartments in it.

A five bay above grade Eastlake porch extends across the entire front of the house. The porch has a bracketed shed roof with an openwork spindle frieze supported by bracketed turned posts on a spindle work railing; decorative brackets also mark the center of each bay.

Windows are spaced evenly on the front elevation with the exception of a small square containing one light between the west bay and the front door. Throughout the house most of the windows contain 1/1 light sash with the upper sashes bordered by small panes of stained glass. The fenestration on the west elevation is rather unusual. The west wing itself is pentagonal in shape and the west elevation wall has small multi-light stained glass windows in the upper corners of the first floor which wrap around it. On the second floor the pentagonal shape is more pronounced, and there are 1/1 light windows on the north-west and southwest sides. Thus the center expanse of the west elevation is actually windowless. The front and rear attic gables have a pair of rectangular 1/1 windows and there is a small pointed gable piercing the main roof over the west bay, second floor. Louvered shutters are present on the front and east elevations, main section and multi-light sash are found in some of the windows on the rear wing.

The main entrance is in the second bay on the front elevation. It contains double doors with vertical panes of glass in the top half and molded panels in the lower. A scalloped band of molding, having a jeweled stained glass transom over it is above the doors.

A slate cross gable roof covers the main section on the east side while the west end has a gable roof with a curved end on the west. The house has a molded box cornice with a side molded fascia board beneath. The central chimney has been removed and a brick exterior and chimney added to the east elevation, main section. The rear wing has a slate gable roof with an end chimney on the south wall.

A small picket fence surrounds the yard which has an old fashioned garden in the rear.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

One of several Queen Anne style houses in Havre de Grace, 617 Fountain St., is believed to have been built for a superintendant of the Havre de Grace Shoe Factory c. 1890. The shoe factory building stands today, two block from the Whyte House. The factory was built by the City of Havre de Grace for John Faust and Sons, shoes manufacturers. Directly behind the house is 618 Bourbon Street, (HA-1145), another Queen Anne Style house almost identical to this one. The Bourbon St. house and 212 S. Stokes (HA-1147) are thought to have been constructed for management level employees at the factory also. The original brick double houses, (HA-1148-1149) which were built for the factory workers are standing also.


