The Cook House, a small two and a half story two bay wide frame dwelling, is believed to have been built around 1832. The house has a gable flank roof with a tall brick interior end chimney which is partially exposed on the end wall. HA-808 (an early 19th century frame dwelling) has a very similar chimney design.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

561 Green Street is a two and a half story two bay wide frame dwelling, covered with aluminum siding, on a low random rubble foundation. The small c. 1832 (18' wide) house faces south on Green Street and it has a two story shed wing on the east side of the rear elevation.

A two bay porch with a hipped roof extends across the entire front elevation; it has bracketed chamfered posts on tall square bases, on the west elevation of the wing is a two bay shed roof porch.

Windows containing 6/6 light double hung pegged sash are on all the elevations. The second story of the wing has a small six light windows on the west elevation.

The main entrance is in the west bay of the front elevation; it has a half paneled, half glass door with a one light transom above it.

The house has a gable flank roof, covered with asphalt shingles. A dormer with a triangular pediment, having 6/6 light sash, is in the center of the front of the roof. It appears to have been added or replaced at a later date. On the east elevation a tall brick chimney rises from the south slope, 1/3 of the chimney is stuccoed and exposed on the east elevation.

The house has a small yard at the rear.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Cook House is a small two and a half story two bay wide frame dwelling under a gable flank roof. It is believed to have been constructed around 1832 by a member of the Cook family-from whom the present owner is descended. The house has an unusually constructed chimney on the east elevation. The chimney is very similar to that on the Nicholas and Gabriel Sutor House (HA-808), another frame house, known to have been built by or for member of the same family. Both chimneys are interior-end chimneys and they are partially exposed on the end of the building.


