The James Fahey House was built in c. 1903 in a mixture of a styles, primarily Queen Anne and Colonial Revival. The most outstanding feature of this two story two bay wide frame dwelling, is its polygonal corner tower with raised garlands, painted green on the upper story. In addition, the house has a Colonial Revival porch on the front.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The James Fahey House is a long two story, two bay frame dwelling with a polygonal tower on the southwest corner. Built in around 1903, the house faces west on Union Ave. with dwellings on either side of it. The house, having a granite foundation, is covered with rounded edge weatherboard, painted white with green trim. The predominant feature of the house is the polygonal tower which has a frieze of garlands painted green on a white background which are either plaster or wood.

A three bay Colonial Revival porch (above grade) extends across the front of the house, It has an iron railing and a deck with a balustrade. The rear wing has a long, above grade four bay porch across it. The porch has a hipped roof supported by bracketed turned and chamfered posts and a metal railing.

Windows are spaced unevenly on the front elevation. There, as throughout the house, they contain 1/1 light sash with in molded enframements. Those in the tower are topped with molded cornices which are painted green on the second story. A three sided bay addition sheltered by the second story, is on the east end of the mainsection south elevation.

The main entrance is in the north bay, front elevation. It has inner and outer doors separated by a small entranceway which has marble wainscotting. The doors themselves are chestnut, the outer door has beveled glass in the upper half while the inner door has leaded glass in it.

The house has a slate hipped roof with an overhanging molded box cornice and a molded fascia board. A brick chimney is hear the east end. The tower has a hexagonal slate roof.

A large yard is to the rear.

Interior: The house is a sidehall and one room wide and four rooms deep; the present kitchen was added. Stairs having chestnut newel and railing are on the north wall of the front and the back hall. Sliding oak doors give access from the hall into the front room. A partition separates the front room and the library; formerly they opened into one another. Wood work and trim on the first floor are chestnut.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Built for a prosperous Havre de Grace businessman in 1903, the James Fahey seems to have been influenced by the Seneca Mansion (HA-815). Like the much larger mansion across the street, the Fahey House is covered with rounded edge weather boards, has a corner tower and displays raised garlands as a decorative motif. At the Fahey House, the garlands, which are painted green, form a raised design around the upper storey of the polygonal corner tower. Perhaps because of the green garland on the tower the house is pictured in several c. 1914 post cards of Union Ave. The house marks a transition in architectural styles; the Queen Anne style is moving into the Colonial Revival.

Union Ave. runs north to south with the Chesapeake Bay at its southern end. Wide and tree shaded, the street has many architecturally significant buildings of different styles on it; it is the City's most impressive street visually. The northern and middle part of the street are rich in 19th and early 20th century architecture. Whereas, at the southern end (between the hospital and the Bay), most of the houses, mixed with MD's offices, are new.


