As late as the 1920's, ice was cut in blocks from the Susquehanna River and delivered door to door and the railroads here, where it was used to pack the fresh produce, fish in particular, from the area. This long frame building on the river was used by the Abbott brothers to store ice cut from the river; the ice was stacked to the ceiling between layers of boards and straw. Later the brothers used the form stone building at the street front of the property to manufacture ice.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Abbott's ice house, a two story frame structure with a gable roof, is located between the Susquehanna River on the east and Water St. on the west, in the vicinity of Ontario and Erie Sts. Now part of the Havre de Grace Marina, the ice house was built c. 1918 by William and Martin Abbott. The two brothers had a business selling ice cut in blocks from the Susquehanna River. The ice was stacked up between layers of straw and boards and stored in this long, low building of rough clapboards.

The building contains two stories at the east gable end, where it is used as a clubhouse by the upper Chesapeake Bay Yacht Club. Windows, added on the first and second story north and south elevations and the first story of the east end have 2/2 light sash. The other major change to the building was the addition of a large picture window (with a door in the center) on the second story east elevation which provides a magnificent view of the Susquehanna River. A deck with a balustrade is in front of the window. Large sliding vertical board doors in the south elevation give access to the remaining storage area. The one story addition on the west elevation has a gable roof parallel to the one on the main structure; both of the roofs are covered with corrugated tin.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Before advances in electrical engineering made it possible to manufacture ice, it was cut in blocks from the Susquehanna River and stored in long barn-like buildings constructed for that purpose. On the property of the Havre de Grace Marina are two large structures which were used and perhaps built by the Abbots for their ice business C. 1911. The long frame structure by the Suquehanna River was the place where ice cut from the river in winter time was stored in high stacks between straw and boards; whereas, the formstone building on Water St. was the ice manufactory. The latter structure is also an interesting example of adaptive re-use, containing a marina supply store with an apartment above it.
