DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Rev. William Wilson House II is a two-story stone house built about 1805 and located on the west side of Sharon Road south of Rigdon Road near Chrome Hill, Harford County, Maryland. The main elevation faces south.

The house has two sections arranged in an L-shape. The main section has a slate gable roof with the ridge on an east-west axis. Interior chimneys with brick tops are located at both gable ends. The cornice is simple and has a plain frieze just above the second floor windows. The main elevation on the south has five bays and a central entrance. A shed porch with plain tapered posts shelters the three central bays. The door has a rectangular transom. The windows are 6/6 and have red louvred shutters. On the gable ends, two 2/2 square attic windows flank the chimney stacks.

The second section is a two-story wing extending north from the north-east corner of the main section. On the east side of the wing are three bays with an entrance in the center bay. This elevation has mainly 9/6 windows with red shutters. There is evidence of plastering on the walls flanking the door, indicating a possible enclosed foyer or porch once existed. An interior chimney is at the north end of the wing. A shed porch extends across the west side of the wing and the north side of the main section. The windows in the wing's west elevation are 9/6, while those in the north side of the main section are 6/6. There are no shutters on these rear elevations. The walls of both sections again have areas of plaster, painted or whitewashed, which may indicate a former addition or may have been done as weatherproofing.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is important for its fine stonemasonry technology and for its association with Rev. William Wilson, a lay minister of local interest. (See Rev. William Wilson House I, HA-1231.) Both Wilson Houses should be studied as a pair. House II was obviously built as a substantial residence. The south and east facades have more carefully dressed stone and coursing than in the rear elevations.

Wilson House I (HA-1231) is typical of tenant houses in the Deer Creek valley in scale and unpretentious construction. House II appears on both the 1858 and 1878 maps, but is identified as Rev. Wilson's house only in 1858. The house may have changed hands during land transfers in the mid-1870's. By 1878, the Wilson name is associated only with House I.




