Probably built between 1858 and 1878 by Dr. John M. Finney, this two-story frame house has been altered substantially on the exterior but is significant for its association with the Finney family. The son of Rev. William Finney of Churchville Presbyterian Church fame, John Miller Finney was a doctor in Churchville for 50 years. He never married, although is said to have been engaged for 40 years to a woman who was an invalid, but would not release him from his pre-nuptial responsibilities. (Some say she feigned her 40-year illness because she was afraid he had lost his heart to another woman and knew a gentleman would never leave a sick woman.)

This house is the third in a group of Finney houses on Glenville Road: Oak Farm (HA-149), built in 1821, Greenwood (HA-1279) built in 1841, and Little Greenwood (HA-1277), built in 1906. Together they witness the progression of tastes through the 19th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two-story, el-shaped frame house is located on the west side of Glenville Road, north of Level Road (Md. Rte. 155).

Set on a low stone foundation and covered in clapboard, the three-bay by two-bay house faces east and the three bay long ell extends to the west; the south end of the east section has a one-room addition. The east section has a hipped roof with a center front gable and wide eaves and two exterior end brick chimneys. Most windows have 6/6 sash, narrow beaded trim, and louvered shutters.

The front or east facade is spanned by a one-story, hipped-roof porch with doric columns. The entrance in the center bay is flanked by one window on each side, with three windows in the second story. The gable contains a triangular window.

The north end of the east section has 4/4 sash windows and a casement window in the western bay of the first story.

The addition on the south end with a gable roof and center front gable, echoes the treatment of the main facade with wide eaves and a triangular gable window. Set on a brick foundation, it has a bay window in the east side.

The house appears to have been T-shaped originally. A two-story, partially-enclosed porch has extended the south side of the stem of the "T" to be flush with the south end of the east section.

The north side of what is now the "ell" has windows in the three bays of both stories, with the exception of the entrance in the first story east bay. The latter has a gable-roofed portico and a glassed-in vestibule.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is said to have been built sometime between 1858 and 1878 by Dr. John Finney, son of the Reverend William Finney. John Miller Finney (b. 1823, d. 1896) was a doctor in Churchville for 50 years, during which time, it is said, he made all his house calls on horseback.

John Finney also owned a house at the corner of Glenville and Level (Rte. 155) roads, which burned in the 1920's. He is said to have lived in the house described here with his father, who moved here after his wife died in 1865, and his sister, Susan Finney. The 19-acre parcel of land--"Old Dan's Lot" -- was deeded from William to John Finney in 1867.¹ When John Finney died in 1896, unmarried and without issue (although with a 40 year engagement to his credit) this lot was sold to Priscilla Wilson for \$1200.² She owned it until her death in 1913, when it was sold to Mary Lee, wife of James Lee for \$3100.³ By 1919, when James G. Crockett purchased the house and 19 acres, the price had jumped to \$8500.⁴ From 1924 until 1943, the property was owned by George C. Umbarger, whose family also owned "Greenwood," another Finney place, across the road.

The house is interesting for its association with the Finney family--one of Harford County's most illustrious. Rev. William Finney was pastor of Churchville Presbyterian Church for 41 years (1813-1854), and John M. Finney's brother Reverend Ebenezer D. Finney was the first pastor of Bel Air Presbyterian Church in 1852 (when it was in the Odd Fellows Hall) and again from 1872-1895.

Another of his brothers, George J. Finney, lived in "Greenwood" and was a county commissioner, a clerk of the board of county commissioners, and chief judge of the orphans court. His nephew, John M. T. Finney, also a doctor, was a leading surgeon in America, tending to President Theodore Roosevelt and helping to found the Union Protestant infirmary, later the Union Memorial Hospital, in Baltimore.


