DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small two-story L-shaped house is at 133 Alice Anne Street in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. Covered in asphalt shingles and with a slate gable roof, the house presents its ell to the street. The entry, with narrow side lights and a three paned transom, occupies the east bay of the main block. The entry and first floor of the east elevation of the ell are shaded by a shed-roofed porch. The porch, supported by turned stock pillars, slants east and is decorated with a narrow row of turned spindles at the roof line and with carved decorative brackets. A shed-roofed bay window decorates the north end of the ell. It has a pair of 4/4 double hung sash windows. All the other windows are single ones of the same type. All the windows are framed in louvered shutters. A center chimney with a corbelled cap rises at the join of the ell and the main block.

The interior is divided into two apartments.

SPECIFIC DATES 1892 BUILDER/ARCHITECT

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This small L-shaped house on Alice Anne Street was built by John G. Rouse in 1892 and sold to Josephine Lytle for \$1300. It has more claim to style than any other house on the block with its L-shape, its shed bay window and its decorative porch. It was also the most expensive of the houses built between 1888 and 1910 along this street in the black section. Lytle took out a mortgage of \$769 on which she ultimately defaulted, and the house was sold at public auction for \$825 and then sold privately to Mary Jane Filey (1902, 108/82). Filey sold it for \$1500 to Howard O'Neill in 1919 (164/36). O'Neill mortgaged it to the Fireside Permanent Building Association and then in 1921 sold it to Collins Brown who assumed the balance of the mortgage of \$1149.35. Brown sold it a few months later to Joseph Hall (173/248), who sold it in 1926 to C. Edna Davis (198/331). Davis mortgaged it that year and ultimately lost it in 1941 when it was sold for \$500 to Millard F. Tilley (269/424). Tilley sold it to Carvel Watters in 1945 (288/109). Watters sold it to Edward D. Higinbothom, which sale went unrecorded. When Higinbothom sold it back to Watters in 1950 it had a \$4800 mortgage on it (1948, 312/359). Watters and his wife separated in 1950, and the property was sold to Carroll Miskimon (522/378) in 1959. Shortly thereafter Miskimon sold it to Alan Getz (541/275). Getz sold it to Carollee Getz in 1973 (938/1081).

Although it is now divided into two flats, this proud little house has been occupied by its owner for most of its life.




