DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This long, shabby, shot-gun house is at 133 Archer Street in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. It is covered in asphalt shingle and has a sheet metal gable roof. Its two bay front (west) elevation shows a four pane casement window in the gable. The second story front and all the side windows are 6/6 double-hung sash. The first story facade has three bays. The two to the south are occupied by floor length windows with their shutters closed. They are probably 2/4 double-hung sash like those of the next house to the north (127 Archer). The entry, in the north bay, is topped by a two pane transom. The facade is shaded in the first story by a shed porch carried on plain posts and having a plain balustrade.

The house appears doubled in length on the north side. A hood is over a side door between the east and west bays of the original block. The south side has a single story shed porch carried on plain posts in the back (east) two bays (corresponding to the two story addition on the other side).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This workingman's house was built in 1887 by Darius Prigg, a white painter, on land purchased in his wife's name (Mary Prigg) from the Bel Air Land Company (59/112) in the Hays Addition. He sold it to Joseph Hall, a black man, in 1894. The Hays Addition is racially mixed today, but seems to have more blacks than whites.

This house is in deplorable condition, probably because its owner lives in far-off Massachusetts.


