A very good example of the Victorian front gable house, the Whitaker house also has a fine front porch with distinctive carved brackets on the chamfered posts. It is also a good example of the almost infinite expansibility of this L-shaped house form. The west side porch has been enclosed and a second story added to it, the shed kitchen on the rear has had a second story added to it, and a whole two story west wing has been added. One of the reasons why this basic L-shaped three rooms and a hall downstairs and three bedrooms upstairs floor plan was so popular was the way it could be enlarged as family needs changed.

Acquilla and Octavian Whitaker built this house in 1872. The Whitaker Brothers built several store buildings on Main Street and were responsible for opening Lee Street.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two and a half story aluminum sided house is at 105 Broadway in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. The main block has a gable roof, with the front ridge line running east and west. A front gable breaks this roof line. The back building of this block has a gable roof whose ridge runs north and south at right angles to the front. A side wing, also with a gable roof, extends to the west. This wing was built in 1951. A single car garage with an east-west gable roof is attached to the east elevation at the south end.

The windows in this three bay house are 6/6 double hung sash with the exception of the two windows on the first floor front (north) which are long 2/2. The upstairs addition (west elevation) has 8/8 double hung sash. The enclosed porch (west elevation) has two sets of triple 6 pane casements. The windows to the wing are 8/8 also. The windows on the front (north) and the east elevation are framed in louvered shutters.

A hipped-roofed porch carried on chamfered posts with jig-sawn brackets and a plain balustrade shelters the first floor front (north). The entrance is in the west bay of the north elevation. It is composed of a two pane transom and a door with glass up and two panels down.

The house was apparently originally two rooms up and down with a shed kitchen. Besides the present front porch, a porch ran the length of the west elevation as well. One entered into a hall; the living room was to the left. A door at the south end of the hall opened to the side porch, and the dining room had a door from the living room to the west of the fireplace and one to the side porch where the dining room door is today. In 1951 Mrs. Hager's brother enclosed the side porch and built a second story room on it. He enclosed a portion of the resultant wide hall in the south end and put in a powder room. The living room was widened by the removal of the old hall wall, the living room-dining room door was removed, and the dining room door to the (former) porch was widened into a square arch opening. The living room mantel was replaced with a new chimney breast entirely of brick. The dining room mantel with square paneled colonettes and a plain frieze is original.

The kitchen is to the south of the dining room and is accessible from that room and the west hall. An enclosed back staircase is in the north wall of this room.

The closed string staircase with two dog legs, square paneled newels and plain balusters looks late 19th century or early 20th century. The woodwork throughout the main block is entirely plain.

There are three bedrooms and a bath upstairs as well as access to the west wing. The west wing is two story in the main with a one bay single story at the west end. This portion of the house, built in 1951, does not contribute to the significance of the site.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This frame house with the front gable is typical of the houses built in Bel Air in the 1870's and early 1880's. Broadway has the largest concentration, but there are other, smaller, houses to the same plan on the Baltimore Pike and throughout the Hays Addition. This one was built, possibly by Jacob Bull, in 1872 on land that Aquilla Whitaker and his brother Octavian bought from Dr. William Munnikhuysen (27/203). The Whittakers lived there, apparently. Acquilla Whitaker and Josephine, Octavian's widow, sold the house to Edwin H. W. Harlan in 1919 (164/14); Harlan sold it the next year to Robertine Spencer (169/5). Spencer sold it to Edgar Reed (1926, 195/477) who lost it during the depression a defaulted mortgage. Alan Wood bought it at auction for \$4000 (241/388) and sold it the next month to William N. Ensor (1936, 242/50). The Ensors sold it in 1941 to Lavinia Bradford (Hager), (269/229). Mrs. Hager has lived there ever since.

In 1951 Mrs. Hager's brother added the west wing which the Hagers rent as an apartment. He also enclosed the side porch (west) and made it into a hall. The door between the living room and dining room was closed up and a new dining room door cut from the hall. A small bathroom was cut off the south end of the hall, and a new brick mantel was built in the living room. Upstairs a room was made over the hall (former side porch). These appear to be the only changes made to the building.
