DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small shiplap house, a rental unit for much of its life, is at 206 N. Hickory in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. It has a three bay front building with a two bay two story back building and a small single story addition on the north bay of the west elevation of that. The ridge of the gable roof of the front building goes from north to south; the gable roof of the back building meets the front at right angles. This is simple workingman's housing in the style used before the gable roof was turned to face the street.

It has 1/1 double-hung sash windows which are probably 20th century replacements. They are flanked by shutters. The only ornament, besides the blood red color of the front (east) elevation, is the shed roof front porch carried on plain square posts. The entrance is in the south bay of the east elevation.

SPECIFIC DATES by 1878

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This small tenant house is of uncertain date. It appears on the 1878 map as belonging to Col. Edwin H. Webster. He bought the property in 1869 (22/220) from Charles W. Lee, but no consideration was mentioned. Lee had sold the lot previously in 1859 to Robert B. Sellers. Sellers joined in conveying to Webster, so it is possible that Sellers had built this little house sometime after 1859 but had not finished paying Lee. At any rate, the house was there by 1878 and remained in Colonel Webster's possession until he died in 1893. His heirs sold it to James W. Peterson in 1907 (120/482). Peterson sold it the next month to Ellen Dowling for \$900 (120/481). It was then occupied by Daniel Carroll of P. Miss Dowling married Frederick Esterly. They lived in the house. In 1920 it was assessed at \$760. She died in 1936 and left the property to her husband for life. He died in 1952, and the property was sold to Frank S. Kearney in 1953 (407/157). Kearney transferred it to a presumed daughter, Marie, who was single, a few months later (1954, 412/398). Miss Kearney sold it to Carl J. Hall in 1963 (627/315). Hall lost it as a result of a lawsuit in 1967 (755/400). The present owner, Samuel Guercio, paid \$1,060.44 and assumed a \$12,980.50 mortgage.

From the look of the house it may originally have been just the front portion - one room up and one down. By 1930 it had reached its present configuration.




