The Hanway-Foy House is typical of the good, solid Harford County farmhouses built in the third quarter of the 19th Century: two stories with a gable roof, clapboard, el-shaped, with a porch around two sides. It was probably built by B. F. Hanway on land he inherited in 1862 from his father, Thomas Hanway, who had owned a store at Creswell as well as the land the Charles Smith House (HA-1066) is on. There are three outbuildings on the property -- a smokehouse/carriage house, a machine shop, and a woodshed. A purported gristmill and a frame tenant house were demolished.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two-story clapboard house with a gable roof is located on the northwest corner of the intersection of Calvary Road (Md. Rte. 136) and Fountain Green Road (Md. Rte. 543) and faces south.

Built in the third quarter of the 19th Century, the house has many typical features of that era: set on a low stone foundation and ell-shaped, the main-or south-section is three bays wide and one room deep; the ell is three bays long and two bays wide with two dormers on each side and a brick chimney near the center. A hip-roofed porch with carved brackets and exposed eaves surrounds the south and east sides of the south section. Most windows have 6/6 sash and louvered shutters and narrow beaded trim. The south section has exposed eaves and an entrance in the east bay of the south side. The ell was altered from a 1-1/2-story saltbox configuration.

"A" On the property are several outbuildings: a frame and cinder block smokehouse/  
 B,C carriage house, a machine shop, and a woodshed. In addition, a frame tenant house and grist mill are reported to have been demolished.

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hanway-Foy House is located on the 150 acres Thomas Hanway left his two sons in 1862, and presumably the house was built subsequently. Thomas Hanway, who owned a store in Creswell as well as the land the Charles Smith house is on, took great pains in his Will to describe the acreage and buildings that each of his children was to inherit, and since he did not ascribe any buildings to the 150 acres, it may be assumed that they were "unimproved" at the time. The house may have been built by B. F. Hanway, Thomas Hanway's son, after he divided the land with his brother Thomas in 1869. The \$500 mortgage he took out with A. Henry Strasbaugh in 1875:<sup>1</sup> calls for insurance of the buildings against fire. After repeated wrastlings in court between Strasbaugh and Hanway, B. Franklin and Hannah Hanway sold their farm to R. Percy Hanway in 1909.<sup>2</sup> In 1968, the farm was sold to Dalmar Investments,<sup>3</sup> and in 1976 the four-acre parcel with the house was sold to Thomas Foy.<sup>4</sup>

The house itself is typical of the third quarter of the 19th Century: 2 stories with a gable roof, e1-shaped with a three bay wide and one room deep main section and a three bay by two bay ell (enlarged from the original dimensions). Its entrance in the end bay is a variation on the usual symmetrically-arranged facade, but overall, the Hanway-Foy House is a good, solid middle class Harford County farmhouse.



The Hanway-Foy House, when previously surveyed, suffered from deferred maintenance. The porch was deteriorated, clapboards were rotted in places, and some window and door openings may have been damaged. Most of the visible exterior elements appear to have dated from its late nineteenth century period of construction. In the years since that original survey, the house has been significantly expanded with the raising of a rear ell, possibly in conjunction with conversion to multi-unit occupancy. The porch has been rebuilt and some or all windows replaced. The changes, though noticeable, do not measurably detract from the architectural integrity of the property.
