

ABSTRACT

Milestone No. 34(36) marks Mason and Dixon's 34th horizontal mile west of the initial stone at the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning point of their 230.228-mile West Line, the longest of their survey lines run and marked to define the boundary between the English provinces of Maryland and Pennsylvania. The monument, first set in 1766, is an embellished, oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, and was quarried and carved in England, originally measuring about 12" square by about 4½' in length, cut to stand about 3' above ground. Reset more securely in 1902 to stand about 1½' high, during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary, it remains essentially that height, is unaltered and in fair condition, with large chips along the northwest and southeast edges. The capital letters P on the north (Pennsylvania) side and M on the south (Maryland) side are clear and intact, and most fluting and margins remain; but there are chips along all edges, and the top is noticeably weathered and with a large pit in the apex. On the federal and state levels, this monument is primarily significant as one of the series of 135 original Mason and Dixon stones still standing along the West Line, commonly known since Civil War times as the Mason-Dixon Line, notable for its historical impact and innovative boundary survey methods. Locally, as one of 17 original monuments in place along the present Harford/York county boundary (3 crownstones, 14 milestones), No. 34(36) is also significant as being amongst the few and diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these two counties.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. 34(36) marks Mason and Dixon's 34th horizontal mile west of the initial stone at the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning point of their 230.228-mile West Line. It is an original milestone, first set in 1766, reset in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary, and remains unaltered at its original site.

The area here is predominantly rural, rolling farmland, interspersed with deciduous woods and an occasional orchard. The site is within Harford County's 5th Election District, York County's Fawn Grove Township; about 1/4 miles southeast of the town of Fawn Grove, Pennsylvania; about 3/4 mile due west of the crossroads area known as Constitution, Maryland/Pennsylvania; about 1000' east of McDermott Road/PA T-586 and the Linkous farmhouse; in an open uncultivated grassy strip separating the Richardson orchard on the north from the Linkous farm lane/telephone poles/farmed fields on the south. It cannot be seen from any road, but rather easily from nearby, and is reasonably/well protected, both by the location and the surrounding property and the owners.

The milestone, as with all original Mason and Dixon West Line monuments, is an embellished, oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, and was quarried and carved in England, originally measuring about 12" square by about 4 1/2' in length, cut to stand about 3' above ground. Reset in 1902 to stand about 1 1/2' high, it remains close to that now (about 15"). The capital letters P on the north (Pennsylvania) side and M on the south (Maryland) side are clear and intact though their circle panels have been damaged by large chips from top to bottom along the northwest and southeast corners. Otherwise: most fluting and margins remain though chipped along all edges and top corners. The top planes are rounded from weathering and there is a large pit in the apex.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. 34(36) is significant on the federal and state levels primarily as one of the series of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments still standing along their 230.228-mile West Line, commonly known since Civil War times as the Mason-Dixon Line, notable for its historical impact and innovative boundary survey methods. The site was preliminarily surveyed in 1765 and monumented the following year, where it remains firmly in place to this day, having been reset more securely in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Individually, and as one of 17 original monuments remaining along the present Harford/York county boundary (3 crown-stones, 14 milestones), No. 34(36) is also significant locally as being amongst the few and diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to our colonial and Civil War heritage.
