This stone structure, commonly known as the Cooksville School House, has been a dwelling house for over thirty years. The Martenet Map of 1878 shows this structure but does not label it as a school. One is indicated further east in Glenville, however. Samuel Mason mentions in Historical Sketches of Harford County, Maryland, that George Cook's sister (her name is not mentioned) taught private school from 1842 until 1862, using the second floor of the building. Mason mentions that in 1862 the entire building was used as a public school but this is not indicated on the Martenet Map.

This structure, with the many other, fine stone buildings which surround it, make up the Cooksville complex, an area shaped and developed by one energetic family through the course over a century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This stone dwelling is one story high, two bays by one. It has a corbeled brick chimney located in the center of the slate covered, gable flank roof. The house is located on the south side of Harmony Church Road and faces north.

Windows on the first elevation are 6/6 and have louvered shutters. The principle entrance is on the northwest bay of the north facade. Three windows are located on each gable end on the second elevation. The center window is six lights over six. This is flanked by a four light, casement window on each side. A shed roof dormer has been added to the south side of the gable flank roof.






