Late 19th century

Schuck's Store was owned by John Schuck, who also owned the Schuck-Tharpe House (HA-1264), just west of the store. The store was built in about 1865. The utilitarian plainness of the store and its prominent location at the crossroads strongly evoke its original appearance and importance in late 19th century rural life.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Schuck's Store is a two-story rectangular frame building with a gable roof and a clapboard exterior located on the southwest corner of Churchville Road (MD 22) and Schucks Road. The late 19th century store is oriented toward the north with its gable end facing Churchville Road. A one-story shed porch with fixed French windows is attached to this elevation, serving as a display area.

The west elevation has four bays and contains the present main entrance. A one-story concrete block addition containing residential space has been built on the southwest corner and south gable end. The fenestration is 6/6 sliding sash except in the French windowed porch/display area and the concrete block addition. A central chimney breaks through the slate roof.

The porch/display area has blue painted wood trim with chamfers at the corner posts. The cornice returns at the gable ends.

A small frame carriage house with board and batten siding is located about 50 feet southwest of the store building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Schuck's Store appears on the 1878 Martenet Map and may have been the combined store and residence of John Schuck, the storekeeper. He acquired the property in about 1863 - 1866 and also owned the Schuck-Tharpe House (HA-1264) just west of the store. The utilitarian plainness of the 19th century country store and its prominent location at the crossroads strongly evoke its original appearance. The modern addition at the rear and west elevations does not greatly impair its character.




