DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mitzel Barn and Badders Silo are located on the south side of Jerrys Road about 1/4 mile east of Madonna Road near Federal Hill, Harford County, Maryland. The barn is a frame building built in 1902 and the silo is a stone and concrete structure built in 1932.

The barn has a stone foundation and is banked on the west elevation. The upper structure is frame with white-painted vertical siding and green trim. The date of construction, 1902, is shown in both the north and south gables in green applied wood numbers. The gable roof is corrugated metal. A concrete block extension has been added during the early 20th century at the southeast corner of the barn. A large door on the south gable end gives access to a milking room. The upper level interior was not accessible in this survey.

The stone silo is located immediately west of the barn. It is a circular structure with a conical stone roof and a vertical opening on the east side extending from the roof to the ground. The silo is 28 feet high above ground and has an additional 28 feet below ground level. The interior is concrete. An inscription in concrete applied to the stone base on the southwest side reads "Built by M. A. Badders and Sons, August 27, 1932."

The existing residential structures on the property are located south and east of the barn. Although at least one may date from the late 19th century, none has the architectural integrity of the barn, or the unusual character of the stone silo.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The large white barn was built by Edgar P. Mitzel who owned the farm from 1895 to 1911. It is remarkable for its relatively unaltered state. Except for the concrete block addition on the southeast corner and some minor changes in windows and entrances, the barn is virtually intact as built.

The stone silo is unusual in Harford County. Square or rectangular stone grain storage structures are not uncommon, but this is the first circular stone silo to be recorded in the Harford County survey. This may be a Pennsylvania influence, as the northwest corner of the County has many examples of architecture and building technique with origins in southern Pennsylvania.

NOTE: HA-1699 was originally assigned to the Norrisville Garage. This was a duplication and was later cancelled. See HA-1618 for the Norrisville Garage.


