## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Stump-Holloway House is a two-story stone house built in 1805 with associated outbuildings which is located on the north side of Stafford Road about 0.5 mile east of Price Road near Darlington, Harford County, Maryland. The main house faces south toward Stafford Road.

The main house has a five-bay main elevation with a center entry under a gabled hood. This elevation has coursed ashlar granite stones, while the other elevations are uncoursed rubble masonry. Brick interior end chimneys rise from the gable ends of the house. The rear or north elevation also has five bays with a center entrance. A wood beam projects out of the stone wall above the door. A smaller scaled stone wing is attached to the northeast corner. This wing parallels the main section and has a shed porch on the south elevation and a door in the north elevation over which is a peaked dormer. Windows in the main house have undoubtedly been altered and now contain 2/2 sash. Most windows are flanked by louvred shutters.

Immediately east of the house is a small stone house probably originally slave quarters or a summer kitchen. It has one story and a three-bay main elevation facing south. There are two rooms, the east room having a large fireplace opening with an inset wood beam with an attached mantel shelf. The north elevation has a door and a single window to its right. The interior shows evidence of having been plastered and the ceiling beams have beaded edges. The gable roof is metal and the ridge sags; the entire building is in a semi-deteriorated state.

A ruined stone house with two adjoining two-story sections is located about 50 feet southeast of the main house. The eastern section is more intact and has two bays with an entrance in the left bay, facing south. The western section is mostly in ruins, with a large hole in the north wall, exposing the sagging second floor level. The interior of this section is filled with debris. There is no apparent chimney in either section. The eastern section has exposed peeled unhewn beams with white-washed plaster and vertical board interior walls. A large tree located near the southwest corner of the house is causing displacement of the walls and probably was the source of the large hole in the slate roof in the west end of the house.

A frame bank barn stands about 100 yards southwest of the house. The loft entrance is on the northwest elevation. The foundation is stone and the roof is slate and metal. On the west is a concrete block extension with a metal roof. The siding is board and batten or vertical.

A small frame garage or wagon shed with a stone foundation and board and batten siding stands on the drive between the house and the barn.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Stump-Holloway House is locally significant for its architecture, in which the cut stone main elevation suggests the attempt to give the vernacular building tradition in the early 19th century an appearance of formality. It is also important as the homestead of Henry and Duckett Stump, whose family was prominent in the development of the Deer Creek mills and other industries near Stafford and Rock Run.

HISTORY AND SUPPORT:

The two-section stone house near the main house may be earlier in date than 1805. It is possible that the family lived in one or more sections of this structure while the main house was being built, the older building then being retained for tenants. The daughter of Henry and Duckett Stump married a Holloway; the house has remained in the Holloway family's possession.

Note: This form consolidates original survey numbers HA-176, 177 (Double House), 178 (Stone Cottage), 315 (Barn). A fifth survey site, HA-358, Village Site, was not located during the current survey and the owners know of no such ruins on their property.

Addition: According to William Stump Forwood's "Homes on Deer Creek" Series in the Aegis - Intelligencer (1879-80), the stonemason of Stump-Holloway House was David Hopkins, who is also credited with the D. H. Springhouse (HA-44), a National Register site, and the D. H. Mounting Block (HA-870), which bears his initials and the date 1819.


Stone farmhouse, 2 stories, 5 bays by 3, facing south, the slate roof ridge line running east-west, well cut granite masonry, the chimneys at each end of the main house are brick, and rise from two ~~heating~~ fireplaces at each end of each floor.

Cooking fireplace was originally in an outer building, it is believed.

Windows have been changed in the 1870's to 1890's with two-janes <sup>in each set</sup> ~~two windows~~ except the little third floor window at the west end of the house - three over six.

A small wing, granite, 3 bays by 2, is smaller also in scale. Its chimney is for a stove, not reaching the ground. (Estimated age 1870-90.) This probably replaced an older kitchen with a cooking fireplace.




