

Item 7, Description (continuation sheet)

This two-story carriage house was built in 1911-12 as part of the Evans Greer estate. According to the Evans-Greer House Maryland Historical Trust inventory form (HA-1414), the structure was constructed simultaneously with the original estate. It is oriented at the end of the long, curving drive, its principal facade being the southeast elevation. The structure is built of irregularly coursed, granite ashlar block on the ground story. The second story is sheathed in wide wooden boards. The roof is side-gabled. An original, fixed-pane, 3/3 window is to the left of the garage openings. It has a rough granite sill and a smooth granite lintel.

Recently, the structure has been renovated: two new garage doors have replaced original carriage doors at the ground level, new 1/1 double-hung windows have been installed at the second story, and new asphalt shingling covers the side-gable roof. A stairway (not original) leads from the ground to a second-story entrance on the northeast elevation.
