
According to the Maryland Historical Trust Inventory Form for the Greer-Evans House (HA-1414), this interesting gate house was built subsequent to the 1911-12 construction of the house. It is built of the same materials as the house and carriage house--granite and wood. The structure is oriented with its principal facade on the northeast elevation.

It is executed in a combination of the Greek Revival and the Bungalow styles. The one-story gate house is built of randomly coursed, rock-faced granite ashlar, with areas of beveled wooden siding and square-butt, wooden shingling in the gable. The Greek Revival influence is evident in the end-gable form with its return cornice and its matching, projecting end-gable portico. The portico features an asphalt-shingled pediment supported by simple, Doric columns, and the primary entrance is Classical in feel. The Bungalow influence is felt in the low, weighty quality of the structure, its rocky base, the entasis of the portico columns, and the heavy brackets which support the roof.

The structure was originally T-shaped, but a newer, wooden-plank, one-story rear deck has obscured this formation. This rear addition features a sliding glass door on the northwest elevation which leads to an open-air deck, built of latticework base and square-post balustrade. The principal (northeast) elevation is two bays wide, both bays being filled with entrances. The primary entrance is in the leftmost bay, and a secondary entrance in the rightmost bay. The primary entrance features a door of wood base with three, horizontally divided panes above. This door is flanked by 5-paned sidelights and fluted pilasters. The secondary entrance features a door with an x-panel, wooden base and diamond-paned fixed glass above. The windows are framed in wood and are double-hung, 1/1 sash.

The intersecting hip and gable roof is sheathed in squared asphalt shingles. The hipped roof is supported by decorative wooden brackets, while the principal gable is supported by large, blocky granite brackets. There is a wide but short, interior granite chimney located along the rear slope of the hipped roof.
