DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Stump-Smithson House is a 2-1/2 story frame house with a shed porch built about 1875 and located on the south side of Stafford Road about 1/4 mile east of Price Road near Darlington, Harford County, Maryland.

The house has a three bay main elevation facing north with a center entry. The door has a rectangular transom and sidelights. The windows are 2/2 with plain architraves. The shed porch has plain square posts. Two gabled dormers project from the composition roof. These also have 2/2 sash, but have a small cornice above. The interior end chimneys are brick. The gable ends have two bays each. A two story wing projects south from the main section. A modern entry has been cut through at the junction of the two sections on the west elevation. The angle between the wing and main section is partially filled by a shed addition containing the present kitchen. The wing also has a brick interior chimney. The foundation is stone and the siding is asbestos shingle.






