The Philips-Mason House, 111 Fulford Ave., faces north set close to the street in Fulford Park. Fulford Avenue is part of the one way system which by-passes the downtown area to the south and carries a great deal of rapidly moving traffic. Across the street are offices, and much of the area either is, or soon will be, commercial. Probably built in 1924 or shortly thereafter, it is a small clapboard bungalow with 3 irregular bays and a gabled front porch carried on 4 round wooden posts. The square post balustrade looks recent.

The early 1920s saw three new additions to the Town of Bel Air: Fulford Park (1922), Ingleside (1923), and Kenmore (1924). In each case the lots were sold at auction. Fulford Park was subdivided by Oliver T. Wallace of Wilmington, North Carolina. The local agent was W. M. Nicholls. It was named for the Fulford family whose land it once was. The Philips-Mason House, probably built in 1924 or 1925, has an unusual porch for a bungalow. It closely resembles the Russell McComas House on Williams St. [HA-1837], which was built in 1926.

It closely resembles the Russell McComas House in Richardson's Addition [HA-1837], which was built in 1926.

A shed-roofed dormer with 2 windows, a three-sided bay window in the north bay of the west elevation, and a rear addition with a continuation of the gable roof complete the simple exterior. Windows are double-hung sash and single except in the dormer and the gable-ends.

The interior was not accessible.


