The Livesey-Deaner House, 103 Powell Avenue, faces north on a large, open lot in Fulford Park. A spacious 2 bay clapboard bungalow built in the 1920s, this house is reminiscent of the shingled Rinehart House [HA-1806] on Webster Street in its large front and rear dormers with 2 paired windows, except this one has a single window in the rear, southeast corner. The continuation of the gable roof forms a porch in the northeast front bay. The enclosure on the northwest bay forms a sun room which may be a later development. It may be original; the James Wheeler house on Hickory Ave. [HA-1810] has a similar construction, and that is original.

The early 1920s saw three new additions to the Town of Bel Air: Fulford Park (1922), Ingleside (1923), and Kenmore (1924). In each case the lots were sold at auction. Fulford Park was subdivided by Oliver T. Wallace of Wilmington, North Carolina. The local agent was W. M. Nicholls. It was named for the Fulford family whose land it once was. This house, built between 1922 and 1930, is an excellent example of the clapboard bungalows being built in town in the 1920s. [Compare the Dale Coale house, HA-1803, built in 1923 in Ingleside.]

To the southeast the gable extends over a back porch in one bay but not in the other. A basement door on the east elevation, 2 panels down and 2 long windows up completes the exterior.

The interior was not accessible.


